December Star Party

Rain forced the cancellation of the December 16th star party, which was to have been held at the Claremont Wilderness Park. But now it is a new year and we have another chance to go out and look at the stars! The January star party will be on the lucky 13th (not a Friday) day of the month so good weather may be anticipated. It will be at Mecca Beach on the Salton Sea. From my house Mecca Beach Campground is exactly 120 miles, which makes it nearly 10 miles closer than Cottonwood. Also, this time of year the temperatures at Mecca Beach are generally a little more comfortable than at Cottonwood. The southern horizon is flat and the other directions are pretty good too. There are some lights at the site, but it is difficult to find a site with absolutely no lights.

To get to Mecca Beach, take the 10 Freeway east to Indio/Coachella. Take Hwy 86S south to 66th Ave. Turn left on 66th Ave. then turn right on Hwy 111. Mecca Beach is the second state campground that you will come to, the first being the Headquarters/Visitor Center/Campground. I hope too see you there.
